TATTERSALLS IRELAND JULY SHOW 2021

(WHILST COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS ARE IN PLACE)

BY SUBMITTING YOUR ENTRY/ENTRIES TO TATTERSALLS IRELAND JULY SHOW YOU ARE AGREEING TO OUR HEALTH AND SAFETY TERMS AND CONDITIONS AS SET OUT BELOW. SHOULD YOU FEEL THAT YOU ARE UNABLE TO ADHERE TO THESE PROTOCOLS YOU SHOULD NOT ATTEND.

ANY PERSON FOUND IN BREACH OF THE PROTOCOLS WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE THE PREMISES AND WILL BE BARRED FROM PARTICIPATION AT FUTURE EVENTS. ALL THOSE ATTENDING MUST FULLY CO-OPERATE WITH THE COVID-19 COMPLIANCE PROTOCOLS FOR THE SITE.

1. THE SHOW IS BEING HELD BEHIND CLOSED DOORS WITH ONLY ONE RIDER AND GROOM PER HORSE.
2. JUDGES WILL NOT RIDE THE HORSES.
3. MASKS ARE MANDATORY AT THE TATTERSALLS JULY SHOW.
4. SOCIAL DISTANCING (MINIMUM 2 METRES) MUST BE ADHERED TO AT ALL TIMES.
5. ENTRIES WILL BE CLOSED SHOULD DEMAND BE HIGH.
6. **NO LATE ENTRIES ACCEPTED AND NO ENTRIES WILL BE TAKEN ON THE DAY.**
7. NO REFUNDS AFTER CLOSE OF ENTRIES.
8. COVID-19 TRACE AND TRACK FORMS GIVING NAME/S AND CONTACT NUMBERS OF RIDERS AND GROOMS MUST BE SUBMITTED ONLINE WITHIN 14 DAYS OF THE SHOW DATE. THESE FORMS WILL BE AVAILABLE ON WWW.ITSPLAINSAILING.COM/CLUB/TATTS AND WILL GO LIVE ON 11th JULY. **PLEASE COMPLETE AND RETURN IMMEDIATELY.** THIS IS NECESSARY IN THE EVENT OF ANY CONTACT TRACING BY THE HSE. THE INFORMATION THEREON WILL NOT BE SHARED WITH ANY THIRD-PARTY GROUP AND WILL ONLY BE USED IN THE EVENT OF CONTACT TRACING.
9. HORSES ARE TO BE TACKED UP AT THE VEHICLE PARKING AREA.
10. COMPETITORS SHOULD LEAVE THE SHOWGROUND ONCE THEIR INVOLVMENT IS FINISHED OR STAY IN THE VICINITY OF THEIR VEHICLE.
11. ENTRY TO ANY SECTION OF THE TATTERSALLS IRELAND SITE/PREMISES, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE GROUNDS BEING USED FOR THE SHOW, IS STRICTLY FORBIDDEN.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This Show will be held in accordance with the regulations governing Covid at the time of the Show.

The Show is being held behind closed doors with only one rider and one groom per horse.

Entries close on Wednesday, 14th July. Pre-entry ONLY. No late entries will be accepted. No entries will be taken on the field.

Entries made via the www.itsplainsailing.com/club/tatts website. There will be no refund of entry fees.

Covid-19 Track and Trace Forms must be completed online within fourteen days of the Show date for each person coming to the Show. These Forms will be available at www.itsplainsailing.com/club/tatts and will go live on 11th July. **Please complete and return without delay.** They will be checked at the entrance gate to the Show.

Judges will not ride the horses.

Face Coverings/Masks must be worn at all times except when competing in a Class. Social distancing (minimum two metres) must be adhered to.

There will be no stabling on site at Tattersalls Ireland.

The Committee reserves the right to change Judges, Rings or Order of Classes at any stage and to restrict the number of entries in each Class.

Competitors must wear correct riding clothes, including protective head covering, mounted on the Showground. Show-jumping Classes to be judged under SJI Rules.

Protective headgear conforming to the current recommended kitemark standard – PAS 015 or EN 1384 and fitted with an adjustable harness is recommended for all riders. Protective headgear conforming to the above standards is compulsory for riders under the age of 16 years and for all riders competing in Performance Classes. In Ridden Show Classes, with the exception of the Ladies Side-Saddle Class, gentlemen and lady riders over 16 years of age may, if they choose, wear a bowler hat (gentlemen) or a velvet hunt cap (ladies).

The Committee reserves the right to refund entry, alter, amalgamate or cancel any class.

Horses and ponies in Ridden Classes must be at least 4 years old.

The Judge's decision is final.

The Committee reserves the right to ask any person to leave the Showground without giving a reason.

No responsibility will be accepted by members of the Committee or Tattersalls Ireland for any loss, damage or accident to persons, animals or property.

Working Hunter Ring - 9 a.m. start (prompt)

General Rules for Working Hunter Classes:

A skull cap or hat and safety harness according to the current approved BSI or European Standard must be worn by ALL competitors in the jumping phase of Working Hunter Classes. Skull caps must have a navy blue or black cover. *No hind boots or bandages of any description are allowed in the collecting ring, warm-up or in the actual class.*

On completion of the jumping phase **all clear rounds** and any other horses the judges may require will be asked to return to the ring. If a horse positively stops, ceases to go forward at any time during its jumping round, or turns its quarters to a fence, or has a complete turnaround, will constitute refusals. If a horse jumps the incorrect fence out of a pen or lane it will be eliminated. Horses displaying continued disobedience, or horses leaving the ring whether mounted or dismounted, will be eliminated.

Class 1 Irish Draught Working Hunter

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over.

Class 2 Novice Working Hunter (*kindly sponsored by Ward Union Hunt*)

Mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a ribbon displayed in their tail), four years old or over, not to have won a total of €250, excluding championship money or (or equivalent values) in prizemoney in any Working Hunter Class, or 20 IE points or 22 points SJI Show-jumping, at home or equivalent equivalent abroad before 1st January in the relevant year. **Irish Draught Horses** graded 'A' by Show Jumping Ireland or competed at Advanced level in Eventing, ie CIC**, CCI**, CNC** or above are not allowed compete. Fences in Novice Working Hunter Classes should have a minimum height of .85m (2'9") and a maximum height of 1.00m (3'3"). Working Hunters may compete 'Hors Concours' in Novice Working Hunter classes in the jumping phase only at the discretion of the Show Secretary but the horse cannot compete in any other Working Hunter classes for the duration of the Show.

LUNCH BREAK

Class 3 Restricted Open Working Hunter

Mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a coloured ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old and over not to have won a total of €500, excluding championship prizemoney, (or equivalent values) in prizemoney in any Working Hunter class, or 50 EI points or 45 points SJI Show-jumping, at home or equivalent abroad before 1st January in the relevant year.

Maximum height of fences 3'6" (1.07m). Working Hunters may compete 'Hors Concours' in Restricted Open Working Hunter classes in the jumping phase only at the discretion of the Show Secretary but the horse cannot compete in any other Working Hunter classes for the duration of that Show.

Class 4 Open Working Hunter (*Qualifier for Royal International Horse Show 2022*)

Mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a coloured ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old and over exceeding 148 cms. (14.2 h.h. approx.) to be judged in accordance with the rules herein set out.

Any horse that has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as at 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter Classes.

To be judged 60% for jumping performance, 40% as for Hunter Classes. The jumping to be judged 40% for actual jumping and 20% style and presence.

Ride and conformation 40%. Fences to be a minimum of 8 and a maximum of 12 in number and a maximum height of 1.14m (3ft.9ins) at the discretion of the Judges. Fences should have a natural appearance and not be easily dislodged. No un-numbered obstacle can be included in the course.

The manner of going to be taken into account. No change of rider or tack will be allowed (unless a horse is ridden under side-saddle, in which case, in order to allow the judge to ride, the saddle may be changed for the riding phase only). A rider can ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then must select only one horse to take forward into the ride and conformation section if so required (no change of rider is allowed).

Class 11 **Amateur Ridden Hunter (*Qualifier for Royal International Horse Show 2022*)**
Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over

A person is an amateur for showing purposes, when showing ridden hunters in amateur classes, if he or she does not during the current or previous year:

- (a) engage in breeding, livery, buying, selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity or as a means of deriving a main source of income
- (b) accept remuneration whether it be monetary or goods in kind for employment in connection with horses in a racing, showing or livery stable or riding school (instruction at Pony Club and Riding Club excepted).
- (c) show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm, or a horse for which his or her immediate family accepts livery or training charges from a person outside the immediate concern

In addition persons classed as Amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as a Brand Ambassador

own/part own an equestrian establishment including but not limited to riding schools, events centre, stud or livery yard in any capacity, or receive any form of remuneration for employment at an equestrian establishment. For the avoidance of doubt for the purpose of this rule, immediate family members of an owner or part owner of an equestrian establishment who work or are howsoever otherwise engaged or involved in any capacity, whether or not for remuneration at the equestrian establishment, will be treated as being an owner or part owner of that equestrian establishment.

- (d) show a horse which a professional rider has ridden in any Ridden Hunter or Ridden Sport Horse class during the current year, with the exception of Working Hunter classes and Ladies Hunter Classes unless the horse has subsequently been re-registered under new ownership.

Ridden Hunter classes for either the Horse of The Year Show or the Royal International Horse Show during the current year, unless the horse has subsequently been re-registered under new ownership.

- (e) Professional show persons must not enter the Amateur Ring whilst the classes are in progress. A professional show person is another term for a professional producer and as such a professional groom who works for a producer can enter the ring to groom. A competitor is not eligible to compete in Amateur classes on an Exhibit which has been qualified for either R.I.H.S. or H.O.Y.S. by a Professional during the current season, except in Ladies & Working Hunter Classes.
