(classes run under rules of Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain)

(Horses wishing to compete in the 2025 RIHS Final must be registered beforehand with the SHB(GB)

Classes 5 & 6: Qualifiers for Finals of Tattersalls Ireland Treo Eile Showing Pathway Series Racehorse to Riding Horse

Classes 21 & 22: The Champion and Reserve Champion will get a Golden Ticket to allow them to compete at the 'Veteran Horse of the Year 2024' Supreme Finals being held at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire NG32 2EF on Sunday, 1st September, 2024.

Those wishing to compete at these Finals must join the Veteran Horse Society and register their horse. They must enter the Supreme Final within 21 days of qualifying,

Veteran Horse Classes

Competitors must be amateurs: horses must be produced and shown by a competitor who has not been involved with professionally producing for the show ring within the past three years. An individual show is expected. No spurs allowed. Judge will not ride and horses will not be stripped. The Veteran Horse Society advise that sensory hairs located around the mouth, nose, eyes and inner ears should not be removed. Conformation is not scored within the VHS system. Marked as follows:-

a. Performance and manners

50 marks

b. Condition for age, suppleness and turnout

50 marks

In the event of a tie, the 'b' mark will take precedence

<u>Tattersalls Ireland and Treo Eile Showing Pathway Racehorse to Riding Horse</u> Series

The horses (both raced and unraced) entered in these Classes should demonstrate good movement, rideability and correct conformation. Each Class will be judged as a Hunter Class. The exracehorses will be divided into two categories to support horses in early retraining and the more experienced horses.

Class 5 Novice Racehorse to Riding Horse Class

For horses, 4 years old or over, mares or geldings, any height. Riders minimum age 16 years.

A Novice is a horse that is in its first two years of affiliated competition* and has not won a Racehorse to Riding Horse Class prior to this season's competition.

Horses to be ridden in a snaffle bridle only with a plain cavesson noseband.

Novice horses will not be required to gallop. The Judge will not ride Novice horses but will request a short individual show as defined by the Judge(s).

*(not above Dressage Ireland preliminary, Eventing Ireland E190, Showjumping Ireland 90cms, AIRC Intermediate, IPC Intermediate)

Class 6 Open Racehorse to Riding Horse Class

For horses, 4 years old or over, mares or geldings, any height. Riders minimum age 16 years. Horses that have won a Racehorse to Riding Horse Class in previous seasons must compete in the Open Class. Horses to be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Riders will be asked to extend the canter with the Class. Horses to be ridden by the Judge.

There is no Championship associated with these Classes.

The Final of the Showing Pathway Series is on Sunday, 3rd September, at the Royal Meath Show, Trim.

The first and second prizewinners in both the Novice and Open Classes at each Qualifier will qualify for the Final. In the case where the first and/or second placed horse has already qualified, the next placed horse may qualify for the Final at the Judges' discretion.

Combinations may only compete on one section (either Novice or Open) at the Final of the Pathway Showing Series. A Novice combination that has qualified for the Final and also wins an Open qualifier throughout the Series, must compete in the Open section of the Showing Pathway Series Final.

Horses competing in the Tattersalls Ireland Treo Eile Showing Pathway Series, must be registered with Treo Eile (FREE on www.treoeile.com/register)

All entries must have a Weatherbys or equivalent Racing Authority passport. The passport must be available for checking at the Show.

Horses must be entered using the name as per the Weatherbys or equivalent recognised foreign Racing Authority passport.

All those entering horses and/or participating in the Show agree to be bound by the Show Rules.



FURTHER DETAILS (see page 4)

Class 7 Small/Lightweight Amateur Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 y.o. or over, (Qualifier for Royal International Horse Show 2025)

- (a) It is expected that Exhibitors will compete in the true spirit of these Rules. The Directors/Board/Council reserve the right, in their absolute discretion, to reclassify an Exhibitor's Amateur status/entry should they deem it necessary.
- A person is an Amateur for the purpose of classes run under Association Rules if (b) he/she does not, during the current of previous season: Engage in breeding, livery, buying, selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity, or as a means of deriving a source of income Receive remuneration, whether it be monetary or goods in kind, for employment in the connection with horses in racing, showing, livery stable or riding school (instruction at Pony Club and Riding Club excepted). This does not include the suppliers of ancillary services such as farriers and vets. Own/part own an equestrian establishment including but not limited to; riding schools, events centre, stud or livery yard in any capacity, or receive any form of remuneration for employment at an equestrian establishment. For the avoidance of doubt for the purpose of this rule, immediate family members of an owner or part owner of an equestrian establishment who work or are howsoever otherwise engaged or involved in any capacity, whether or not for remuneration at the equestrian establishment, will be treated as being an owner or part owner of that equestrian establishment.

Show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm, or act as a Brand Ambassador, in any showing classes, SHB(GB) or otherwise, or a Horse for which his/her immediate family accepts livery or training charges from a person outside the immediate family concerned.

PLEASE NOTE:

- (a) If you ride/compete equines on a regular basis, which you do not stable at home, your Amateur status will be reviewed by the Board/Council, i.e. if you ride/compete multiple equines or ride regularly for one or more owners, you could be deemed professional.
- (b) A competitor is not eligible to compete in Amateur classes on an Exhibit which has been ridden by a Professional Rider in ANY class, SHB(GB) or otherwise, with the exception of Working classes, Side-Saddle classes AND Novice classes, during the current year and the following year, up to but not including the Royal International Horse Show.
- (c) (The above Rule (b) does not apply, if the horse has been Professionally Produced and ONLY ridden by a Professional, during the current season, or if the horse has subsequently been sold and re-registered under new Ownership).
- (d) On the day when an Exhibit is competing in Amateur classes, Professionals, including Professional Grooms, are not allowed to ride, to work-in (in any form), compete or enter the Ring to groom/strip the horse.
- (e) No commercial branding can be visible in the ring, during Amateur classes (including Amateur Home Produced), this applies to equines, riders and any attendees; this also Includes outside the ring, or online, i.e. on social media.
- Class 8 Middle/Heavyweight Amateur Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding, four years old or over (Qualifier for Royal International Horse Show 2025)

AMATEUR RIDDEN HORSE CHAMPIONSHIP

Working Hunter Ring - 9.00 a.m. start (prompt)

(kindly sponsored by TopSpec)

General Rules for Working Hunter Classes:

A skull cap or hat and safety harness according to the current approved BSI or European Standard must be worn by ALL competitors in the jumping phase of Working Hunter Classes. Skull caps must have a navy blue or black cover. *No hind boots or bandages of any description are allowed in the collecting ring, warm-up or in the actual class.*

On completion of the jumping phase <u>all clear rounds</u> and any other horses the judges may require will be asked to return to the ring. If a horse positively stops, ceases to go forward at any time during its jumping round, or turns its quarters to a fence, or has a complete turnaround, will constitute refusals. If a horse jumps the incorrect fence out of a pen or lane it will be eliminated. Horses displaying continued disobedience, or horses leaving the ring whether mounted or dismounted, will be eliminated.

PENALTIES: First Refusal: 15

Second Refusal: 20

Third Refusal: Elimination

Jumping Knockdown: 10

Fall or Horse or Rider: Elimination

Class 9 Green Hunter Class. Open to Novice Horses of any age showing over fences. Height of fences will not exceed 80 cms. Riders must be 16 years old or over on 1st January, 2024. Riders will show their animal's paces immediately after the jumping phase. Animals will not be ridden by the Judge.

MARKING: Phase 1 – Jumping 40 marks, Style 20 marks

Phase 2 - Show/Ride 20 marks, Conformation 20 marks

PENALTIES: 10 marks for each fence knockdown. 15 marks for first refusal.

20 marks second refusal. Elimination third refusal

Elimination for the fall of either horse or rider – a rider may not

remount in the ring

In the event of equality, the JUMP mark will take precedence, followed by the RIDE mark, CONFORMATION mark and then the

STYLE mark

Riders under 20 years of age must wear back protectors

HATS: It is the sole responsibility of riders to ensure that at all times while mounted, they wear correctly fitting, 3-point protective headgear which complies with the latest British Safety Institute Standard

Plain boots are permitted in the Jumping Pha

Class 10 Thoroughbred Working Hunter (kindly sponsored by Treo Eile)

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height. Riders minimum age 16 years. Fences not to exceed 80cms to be judged as follows:

80% jumping phase – to be judged on performance, movement and rideability.

20% conformation

Class 11 Novice Working Hunter

Mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a ribbon displayed in their tail), four years old or over, not to have won a total of €250, excluding championship money or (or equivalent values) in prizemoney in any Working Hunter Class, or 20 IE points or 22 points SJI Show-jumping, at home or equivalent equivalent abroad before 1st January in the relevant year. **Irish Draught Horses** graded 'A' by Show Jumping Ireland or competed at Advanced level in Eventing, ie CIC**, CCI**, CNC** or above are not allowed compete. Fences in Novice Working Hunter Classes should have a minimum height of 80cms and a maximum height of 95cms.

Working Hunters may compete 'Hors Concours' in Novice Working Hunter classes in the jumping phase only at the discretion of the Show Secretary but the horse cannot compete in any other Working Hunter classes for the duration of the Show.

LUNCH BREAK

Class 12 105cm Open Working Hunter

Mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a coloured ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old and over.

The maximum height of fences is 105cms.

This Class is intended as a 'step up' Class and it is hoped that competitors will enter into the spirit of this.

An award will be made to the highest placed Novice and the highest placed Amateur in this Class.

Class 13 Open Working Hunter (Qualifier for Royal International Horse Show 2025)

Mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a coloured ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old and over exceeding 148 cms. (14.2 h.h. approx.) to be judged in accordance with the rules herein set out. Any horse that has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as at 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter Classes.

To be judged 60% for jumping performance, 40% as for Hunter Classes. The jumping to be judged 40% for actual jumping and 20% style and presence. Ride and conformation 40%. Fences to be a minimum of 8 and a maximum of 12 in number and a maximum height of 1.14m (3ft.9ins) at the discretion of the Judges. Fences should have a natural appearance and not be easily dislodged. No un-numbered obstacle can be included in the course.

The manner of going to be taken into account. No change of rider or tack will be allowed (unless a horse is ridden under side-saddle, in which case, in order to allow the judge to ride, the saddle may be changed for the riding phase only). A rider can ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then must select only one horse to take forward into the ride and conformation section if so required (no change of rider is allowed).


Rules

- 3. The Committee reserves the right to refund entry, alter, amalgamate or cancel any class.
- 4. The Committee reserves the right to change Judges, Rings or Order of Classes at any stage.
- 5. Horses and ponies in Ridden Classes must be at least 4 years old.
- 6. The Judge's decision is final.
- 7. The Committee reserves the right to ask any person to leave the Showground without giving a reason.
- 8. Entry fees will not be refunded.
- 9. No responsibility will be accepted by members of the Committee or Tattersalls Ireland for any loss, damage or accident to persons, animals or property.
