Tattersalls Ireland/Treo Eile Showing Pathway Racehorse to Riding Horse Series

The aim of the Tattersalls Ireland/Treo Eile Showing Pathway Series 2026 is to identify racehorses which are judged to have transitioned to be suitable riding horses. The horses entered in these Classes should demonstrate good movement, rideability and correct conformation. Each Class will be judged as a Hunter Class. Raced and unraced thoroughbreds are eligible to participate in the Series.

CLASSES:

There are two categories. (For safety reasons, if sufficient entries are received for the Novice Racehorse to Riding Horse Class, in consultation with the show secretary, the class may be divided into two sections):

Novice Racehorse to Riding Horse Class

- For horses, 4 years old or over, mares or geldings, any height. Riders minimum age 16 years.
- A Novice is a horse that is in its first two years of affiliated competition* and has not won a Racehorse to Riding Horse Class prior to this season's competition.
- Horses to be ridden in a snaffle bridle only with a plain cavesson noseband.
- Novice horses will not be required to gallop. The Judge will not ride Novice horses but will request a short individual show as defined by the Judge(s).

**(not above Dressage Ireland preliminary, Eventing Ireland E190, Showjumping Ireland 90cms, AIRC Intermediate, IPC Intermediate)*

Open Racehorse to Riding Horse Class

- For horses, 4 years old or over, mares or geldings, any height. Riders minimum age 16 years.
- Horses that have won a Racehorse to Riding Horse Class and/or competed in the Racehorse to Riding Horse Class at the Dublin Horse Show in previous seasons must compete in the Open Class.
- Horses to be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Riders will be asked to extend the canter with the Class. Horses to be ridden by the Judge.

Final:

The Final of the Showing Pathway Series is on Sunday, 26th July at the Tattersalls Show.

Qualification for Final:

- The first and second prize winners in both the Novice and Open Classes at each Qualifier will qualify for the Final. In the case where the first and/or second placed horse has already qualified, the next placed horse may qualify for the Final at the Judges' discretion. In the case of the first and/or second placed horses not being available to attend the Final, the third of subsequent horse may be invited to take a place in the Final, at Treo Eile's discretion/ In this case, should the 'next placed' horse be already qualified for the Novice Final, they are not obliged to take the place in the Open Section.
- Combinations may only compete on one section (either Novice or Open) at the Final of the Tattersalls Ireland/Treo Eile Showing Pathway Series. A Novice combination that has qualified for the Final and also qualifies in an Open qualifier throughout the Series, must compete in the Open section of the Showing Pathway Series Final.
- A Novice horse that has competed in the Racehorse to Riding Horse Class at the Dublin Horse Show, may not return to compete in the Novice section of the Tattersalls Ireland/Treo Eile Showing Pathway Series. The Final is restricted to the exact rider/horse combination that qualified, with no substitutions permitted.

Entry Requirement:

- Horses competing in the Tattersalls Ireland/Treo Eile Showing Pathway Series, must be registered with Treo Eile (FREE on www.treoeile.com/register)
- All entries must have a Weatherbys or equivalent Racing Authority passport. The passport must be available for checking at the Show.
- Horses must be entered using the name as per the Weatherbys or equivalent recognised foreign Racing Authority passport.
- To compete in the Showing Pathway Series Final, horses' names must be registered with Weatherbys or equivalent Racing Authority. **BHA Naming Form.**

2026 Treo Eile Thoroughbred Performance Classes

The aim of the Treo Eile Thoroughbred Performance Classes is to demonstrate the potential of the Thoroughbred horse and the suitability of ex-racehorses in a second career; rideability, scope, versatility and suitability for the amateur and professional rider. Overview of classes as follows:

FORMAT OF CLASSES:

***Intermediate Thoroughbred Performance Class – 90cms**
Open Thoroughbred Performance – 1metre

The classes incorporate two phases, Flatwork and Jumping.

The competitor will complete a Flatwork format as provided. They will proceed to the Jumping Arena.

The Jumping course will consist of approximately six showjumping fences and six cross-country style fences.

**Horses that have not competed above Eventing Ireland E1100, Showjumpng Ireland 1m, AIRC Open, IPS Intermediate*

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

Horses must be registered with Treo Eile (FREE on www.treoeile.com/register).

All entries must have a Weatherbys or equivalent Racing Authority passport. The passport must be available for checking at the Show.

Horses must be entered using the name as per Weatherbys or equivalent recognised foreign Racing Authority passport.

Horses names must be registered with Weatherbys or equivalent Racing Authority. Please contact hello@treoeile.com to obtain a naming form at the Weatherbys reduced fee.

AGE OF HORSES AND RIDERS:

Horses eligible to compete must be 4-year-old (foaled in 2022) or over.

Riders must be in their fourteenth year or over.

Amateur Status

- a.** It is expected that Exhibitors will compete in the true spirit of these Rules. The Council reserve the right, in their absolute discretion, to reclassify an Exhibitor's Amateur status/entry should they deem it necessary.
A person is an Amateur for the purpose of classes run under Association Rules if he/she does not, during the current of previous season:
- (i) Engage in showing livery/production, buying, selling, dealing or hiring horses in any commercial capacity, or owning/standing a stallion at stud, teaching or coaching, as a means of deriving a source of income
 - (ii) Receive remuneration, whether it be monetary or goods in kind, for employment in the connection with horses in showing livery/production, teaching or coaching, (instruction at Pony Club and Riding Club excepted). This Rule does not include the suppliers of ancillary services in equestrianism, such as farriers, vets, therapists or administrative office roles.
 - (iii) Show a Horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm, or show Horse for which his/her immediate family accepts showing livery production or training charges, from a person outside the immediate family concerned, in any showing classes, SHB(GB) or otherwise.
 - (iv) Act as a Brand Ambassador, in any showing classes, SHB(GB) or otherwise.
 - (v) A competitor is not eligible to compete in Amateur classes on an Exhibit which has been ridden by a Professional Rider in ANY class, SHB(GB) or otherwise, with the exception of Working and Side-Saddle classes during the current year and the following year, up to and including the Royal International Horse Show.
 - (vi) (The above Rule does not apply, if the horse has been Professionally Produced and ONLY ridden by a Showing Professional, during the previous season, or if the horse has subsequently been sold and re-registered under new Ownership).
 - (vii) If you ride/compete equines on a regular basis, which you do not stable at home, your Amateur status will be reviewed by the Board/Council, i.e. if you ride/compete multiple equines or ride regularly for one or more owners, you could be deemed professional.
- b.** At any time whilst on the showground, where an Exhibitor is going to be competing in Amateur classes, Showing Professionals, including Professional Show Grooms, are not allowed to ride, work-in (in any form), teach or coach the rider/horse, compete, or enter the Ring to groom/strip the Horse, on the day it is competing in Amateur Classes. At a stay-away show, this Rule is extended to also include the day before it is competing: horses may be lunged by the professional on the day before competition in the circumstance.

Amateur Owner/Rider:

Open to Horses owned and ridden by an Amateur. This ruling will also apply to Amateurs who wish to compete in the Annual Points Awards. No Showing Professional, including Professional Show Grooms, are allowed into the ring to groom/strip the Horse.

Amateur Home Produced:

Open to Horses, which are either stabled at home or in a DIY yard, assisted livery permitted and which since 1st January in the current year have not been shown by a Professional during the current season or stabled in a Professional yard at any time in the current year. To be ridden by an Amateur. This does not exclude Amateur Owner Home Produced riders having lessons at any time with an instructor, providing the Horse remains stabled at home. No Showing Professional, including Professional Show Grooms, are allowed into the ring to groom/strip the Horse.

Class 8 Middle/Heavyweight Amateur Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding, four years old or over
(Qualifier for Royal International Horse Show 2027)

General Rules for Working Hunter Classes:

A skull cap or hat and safety harness according to the current approved BSI or European Standard must be worn by ALL competitors in the jumping phase of Working Hunter Classes. Skull caps must have a navy blue or black cover. ***No hind boots or bandages of any description are allowed in the collecting ring, warm-up or in the actual class.***

On completion of the jumping phase **all clear rounds** and any other horses the judges may require will be asked to return to the ring. If a horse positively stops, ceases to go forward at any time during its jumping round, or turns its quarters to a fence, or has a complete turnaround, these constitute refusals. If a horse jumps the incorrect fence out of a pen or lane it will be eliminated. Horses displaying continued disobedience, or horses leaving the ring whether mounted or dismounted, will be eliminated.

Class 9 Treo Eile Thoroughbred Working Hunter *(kindly sponsored by Treo Eile)*

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height. Riders minimum age 16 years.
Fences not to exceed 80cms to be judged as follows:
80% jumping phase – to be judged on performance, movement and rideability.
20% conformation

Class 10 105cms Open Working Hunter

Mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a coloured ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old and over.
The maximum height of fences is 105cms.
This Class is intended as a 'step up' Class and it is hoped that competitors will enter into the spirit of this.
An award will be made to the highest placed Novice and the highest placed Amateur in this Class.

Class 11 The Eamonn Egan Open Working Hunter

(Qualifier for Royal International Horse Show 2027)

Mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a coloured ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old and over exceeding 148 cms. (14.2 h.h. approx.) to be judged in accordance with the rules herein set out.
Any horse that has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as at 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter Classes.

To be judged 60% for jumping performance, 40% as for Hunter Classes. The jumping to be judged 40% for actual jumping and 20% style and presence. Ride and conformation 40%. Fences to be a minimum of 8 and a maximum of 12 in number and a maximum height of 1.14m (3ft.9ins) at the discretion of the Judges. Fences should have a natural appearance and not be easily dislodged. No un-numbered obstacle can be included in the course. The manner of going to be taken into account. No change of rider or tack will be allowed (unless a horse is ridden under side-saddle, in which case, in order to allow the judge to ride, the saddle may be changed for the riding phase only. A rider can ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then must select only one horse to take forward into the ride and conformation section if so required (no change of rider is allowed).

LUNCH BREAK

Class 12 Green Hunter Class. For Novice Horses of any age showing over fences. Height of fences will not exceed 80 cms. Riders must be 16 years old or over on 1st January, 2026. Riders will show their animal's paces immediately after the jumping phase. Animals will not be ridden by the Judge.

MARKING: **Phase 1** – Jumping 40 marks, Style 20 marks

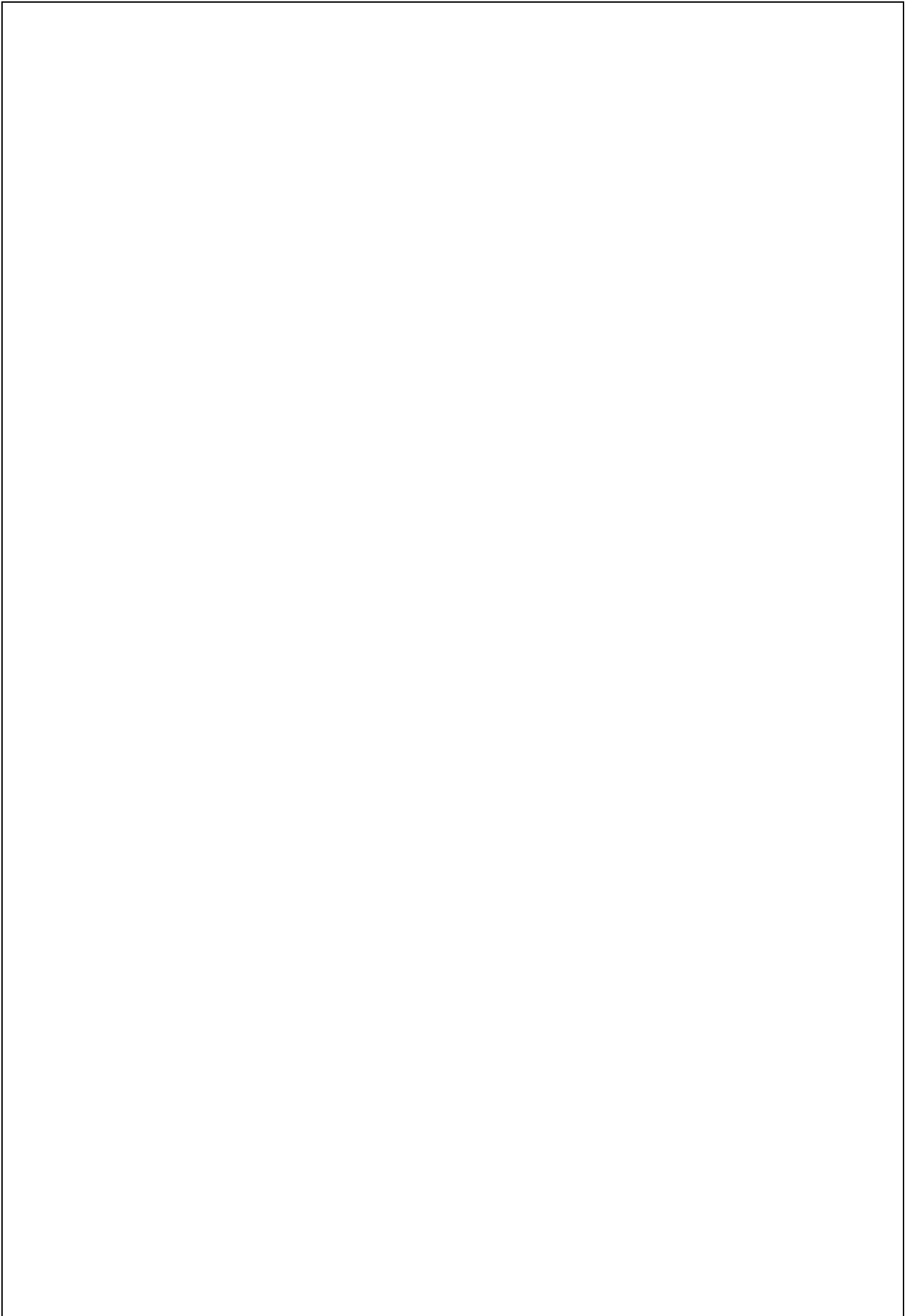
