## DUBARRY BURGHLEY YOUNG EVENT HORSE SERIES

This hugely popular competition, now in its third decade has been integral to Burghley Horse Trials and remains acknowledged as **the** shop window to view potential 'five star' horses at an early age.

Open to four and five-year-olds, the aim of the Series is to encourage breeders and trainers to produce and present the type of young horse which will be the best material to make a world class three-day event horse.

The judges look for an athletic, loose moving horse with a promising jumping technique and attitude which, with correct training and production, will develop physically and mentally into a strong three-day event horse.

The winner is that with the highest overall marks from four sections:

<b>Section I</b>	<b>Dressage</b>	Marked out of 30
<b>Section II</b>	<b>Jumping</b> up to 0.90m for 4 year olds and up to 1.05m for 5 year olds	Marked out of 40
<b>Section III</b>	<b>Conformation (12 marks) &amp; Quality (8 marks)</b>	Marked out of 20
<b>Section IV</b>	<b>Suitability &amp; Potential</b>	1-10 marks

Dressage: each horse performs a simple dressage test to demonstrate obedience, suppleness and, good elastic and regular gaits. Marks are not awarded for individual movements.

Jumping: follows immediately after the dressage. Judges are looking for a bold athletic horse with good technique. A horse should not necessarily be penalised for knocking down **one fence** (or even a four-year-old having one refusal), providing he learns from his mistake. However, a fall of horse or rider or three cumulative refusals will result in elimination.

Conformation and Quality: assessed in hand. The horses' build and type should enable them to withstand the demands of the sport in terms of soundness, speed and stamina.

Suitability and Potential: the top ten highest scoring horses from sections I – III are invited to come into the Ring to be assessed on potential quality for international competition. The horses are brought into line in the order that the judge sees their potential. Ten marks will be awarded to the horse that the judge selects first, 9 to the second, 8 to the third, etc down to 1 mark to the tenth horse. These marks are added to those from the previous 3 sections to establish the winner

One horse per 15 starters at today's event will qualify for the Dubarry Burghley Young Event Horse Finals which take place at the Land Rover Burghley Horse Trials on Friday, 6 September. ### CONDITIONS:

1. Horses must exceed 148cm without shoes.
2. Open to horses foaled in 2014 and 2015.
3. SADDLERY (warm-up and competition): tack as per British Eventing Rules for Novice Dressage - snaffle bridle only. For copy check website [www.britisheventing.com](http://www.britisheventing.com). Running martingale only and front boots are optional for sections I, II and IV. However, NO hind boots or bandages of any kind may be worn in the collecting ring, warm-up area or actual class. Jumping whip only allowed (max length 75cm).
4. DRESS: As for British Eventing Novice Dressage Test/Hunting Dress. British Eventing / BHS approved hat and harness to be worn **for all sections**.
5. Opening Date: from date of publication of Schedule.
6. Closing Date: 11<sup>th</sup> July. In the event of oversubscription this class may be closed early.
7. Balloting: in the event of over subscription entries received for horses that have already qualified for the Final will be balloted first.

9. Withdrawals: by 8 p.m. Monday, 15<sup>th</sup> July.

10. Starting Times: available by telephone Wednesday, 17<sup>th</sup> July between 7-9 p.m.
11. Horses will be ridden by the judge at the Finals.
12. Conflict of Interest: within the closely connected equestrian profession, there may be times when a conflict of interest occurs. For guidance it has been determined that a conflict of interest would arise should a proposed judge have bred or owned, kept at livery, ridden in competition, or has financial interest or gain from the horse being judged.

## JUDGING

**SECTION I** Dressage Test (60m x 20m) Arena  
Marks will not be awarded for individual movements but the test will be marked for general impression and overall performance.

### TEST

To be ridden from memory

A Enter in working trot  
From X proceed directly to  
M Working trot  
C Serpentine 3 loops each loop to go to side of the arena finishing at A  
F X H Change rein showing some lengthened strides  
(Not required for 4 year olds)  
Between H&C Working canter right  
C Circle right 20m diameter  
M X K Change rein with transition to trot between X and K  
Between K&A Working canter left  
A Circle left 20m diameter  
Between A&F Working trot  
Between F&B Medium walk  
B Half 20m circle left in free walk on a long rein to E  
E Directly to A - leave arena free walk on a long rein

To be followed immediately by:

**SECTION II** Jumping. NO time will be allowed between these sections for any adjustment to tack or rider's dress. Maximum height of fences 0.90m (4 years) 1.05m (5 years).  
**Fall of horse or rider or a total of 3 refusals will result in elimination.**  
*Note: fence height at Final 1.00m (4 year olds) and 1.10m (5 year olds).*

**SECTION III** Conformation (12 marks) and Quality (8 marks)  
*Note: following Section III, the ten horses with the highest marks will proceed to section IV. In the event of equality of marks at this stage, the horse with the higher jumping mark will be given precedence. Should this still produce an equality of marks, all horses on that same jumping mark will come forward.*

**SECTION IV** Suitability and Potential  
*Only the top ten horses are required for this section where they will be judged for potential international quality to make a WORLD CLASS THREE DAY EVENT HORSE. The 5 year old horses will be required to **gallop one at a time**. The 4 year olds will only be required to show a forward moving canter indicating they could learn to gallop with further development and maturity. It is the responsibility of the rider to ensure they present themselves in time for this section which usually takes place 10-15 minutes after the last horse.*  
*Note: in the event of equality of marks at the end, i.e. after all four sections, the jumping mark will be given precedence. Should this still produce an equality of marks, the highest mark attained in the final section will be the deciding factor.*



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
